Most doctors think total cholesterol and LDL cholesterol must be rigidly controlled in order to reduce heart disease risks, yet half of the people suffering a heart attack have normal cholesterol levels. Cardiovascular diseases, especially coronary heart disease (CHD), are epidemic in India. The Registrar General of India reported that CHD led to 17% of total deaths and 26% of adult deaths in 2001-2003, which increased to 23% of total and 32% of adult deaths in 2010-2013.
