Opened to traffic on June 5, 1953, the Squirrel Hill Tunnel carries Interstate 376 & U.S. 22-30 under Squirrel Hill in Pittsburgh. The 4,225-foot, twin-tube tunnel bypasses the neighborhoods east of Beechwood Avenue and south of Forward Avenue. 5 Each tube accommodates two lanes of travel.
