Coverage only has to be offered to full-time employees under the Affordable Care Act's employer mandate .Answer. If you have a 90 waiting period that will cause a gap longer than 3 months then consider either paying the fee or getting another plan in the meantime. If you have coverage for even one day of a month you are considered covered for that month. So 80 days is fine, 90 days may even be fine during months with 30 and 31 days,...
